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
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March 19 - 22

The Indigenous Ambassador Scholarship for Acting and Film Production is an exhilarating opportunity for any young actors and filmmakers in the Indigenous community who would like the chance to have some financial help with their diploma.

Scholarship Details:

- 2 awards of fully paid tuition towards Acting for Film + Television 1-year diploma program, awarded to 1 male and 1 female recipient.
- 2 awards of 10,000 towards tuition in Acting for Film + Television 1-year diploma program.
- 2 awards of 5,000 towards tuition in Acting Essentials 4-month certificate program.
- 1 award of fully paid tuition towards Film Production 1-year diploma program

* The VFS Indigenous Acting Scholarship will be applied towards eligible program tuition and has no redeemable cash value.

Keith Johnstone, improv pioneer, came to GP Vanier Secondary in Courtenay to do a two day workshop with a group of excited teachers, students and community members. Johnstone spent two days guiding the participants in dozens of activities and games, so many of them familiar to readers of his books *Impro* and *Impro for Storytellers*, but still relevant and fun for everyone. Funny, sometimes forgetful, but always knowledgeable, he shared his wisdom about improv (and life) with the group. It was also an opportunity for teachers to stretch their improv muscles, and actually get up on stage, something that THIS improv coach doesn't do nearly as often as I should.

SPOTLIGHT ON... New Westminster Secondary School

The NWSS Drama Department is thriving, despite lack of teaching space, funding and an impending construction of the much anticipated new school.

Drama teachers, Traci Cave and Frances Monteleone, truly believe that a theatre is the heart of a community and they work to teach and spread the concept of "Drama Love" to their students. The classes provide a safe place for students to learn, explore and feel.


Over the years, they have increased the number of drama blocks from grades 9 through to 12 and are excited to be offering new options for the coming school year. After implementing the Musical Theatre Program a few years ago (for which students receive 8 arts credits), they are now introducing a musical theatre fundamentals course to focus on the basics of the three disciplines of acting, singing and dancing. With great interest in their Hair & Makeup club, they are seeing tremendous growth in numbers. Coming off a successful run of "Crazy For You" on the Massey Theatre Stage, they are gearing up for their annual anti-bullying presentation "Rock Solid". This production presents original works that showcase the importance of acknowledging poor behaviours within the school community. They also have a bridging program with the local elementary and middle schools where they mentor younger students and advocate against bullying. In addition, they present original Remembrance Day plays and their annual productions of "NDub's Got Drama", a comedic showcase featuring the senior acting students. Traci and Frances work to include cross-curricular activities into their unit plans and work closely with the creative writing students as well. Outside of the classroom setting, they offer opportunities for students to participate in both club and competitive improv. With assistance from the NWSS drama students, Frances and Traci often teach workshops and drama camps to younger students from district schools to increase interest in their programs. They are currently gearing up for their second trip to NYC with a group of 32 students.

ABCDE Scholarship

It's time to start thinking about potential scholarship applicants for this year's award. Each year the ABCDE awards a \$750 scholarship to a deserving individual who is pursuing education in theatre or technical theatre. Applications should be completed and sent in by May 31st, 2018

ABCDE Teacher awards

The ABCDE has three awards which it can award annually:

DRAMA TEACHER OF THE YEAR for a practicing teacher and ABCDE member. It may go to anyone who teaches K-12 and incorporates Drama in and beyond the classroom, such as touring shows to other schools, going to see other people's theatrical work, having professionals in the school working with students etc.

DISTINGUISHED SERVICE is for an individual who is an advocate for Drama in B.C. schools and whose work reflects the policies and goals of ABCDE. This award could go to administrators, university instructors, community members, parents, professional individuals and companies etc.

DRAMA IN EDUCATION is for a member of ABCDE who has shown outstanding work in the field of Drama as an excellent teacher with students, an advocate of the arts, and as a facilitator and/or teacher of other teachers.

Please consider nominating someone deserving. Deadline for nominations for next year is September 30, 2018.
