LESSON IDEA

A few years back at one of our ABCDE conferences I picked up a complimentary copy of the text "Drama Works" published by Emond Montgomery Publications. A performance challenge lesson I found in this text, that my students and I have had lots of fun with, is the "Vocal Collage". Here is the lesson as written in the text:

CREATING A VOCAL COLLAGE

A vocal collage is a vocal presentation based on a theme or subject that you construct using a variety of sources. Your vocal collage must include the following:

- -a definition
- -a list of synonyms or related words
- -a famous quote or saying concerning the subject
- -a poem or limerick
- -a line or section from a play written by Shakespeare
- -a tongue twister
- -a selection of prose from a novel or film
- a selection of prose from a non-fiction work
- -a selection from a song
- -sound effects

Creating:

Possible themes or subjects are:

- -peer pressure
- -humankind's impact on the environment
- -dreams

Why do the sources that you selected interest you as a basis for drama?

Try to weave together all the components so that your collage works as a unified vocal presentation.

Use repetitive words, phrases, sounds, and rhythms to transition from one excerpt to another.

** Note: I had my classes create a movement score to go along with the vocal collage and we presented them as a performance piece. ** ENJOY!!

What do you do during your Show's Run?

At W.L. Seaton Secondary's 27th Street Theatre, in Vernon, BC, we like to train our students to run the show completely without our assistance. We hand the show over to the stage manager (almost...I still do warm up...just can't let go completely!) and then sit back and let them work. It is always so gratifying to watch the crew check the lights for burned out bulbs, run sound cues in pre-show, and do mic checks, repair broken set pieces or props if necessary, and prepare the stage for the show. Meanwhile, the actors are a-buzz in the dressing room doing hair and make-up, and the front of house kids are greeting our patrons and helping them to their seats.


So...what do I do while all this is going on? Well, depending on the show, sometimes I watch and enjoy from my perch in the corner of the catwalk. But, most often I am re-setting my office back to zero to get ready for the next semester and the next productions. In fact, as I write this, I have just finished cleaning off my desk. Tonight is the 4th show of CINDERELLA: A Country & Western Pantomime and it has taken me 3 days to get the desk back in shape. Tonight, I'll probably watch part of the show, but I also need to tackle the filing cabinet. Almost all my resources are digital now, and it's time to go through all the paper resources that have accumulated, and pair it down. My goal is to scan one copy of the things in there, and store them digitally as well. We'll see how that goes.

As second semester begins to rise on the horizon, I am extremely excited to begin work in the Theatre Company and Stagecraft classes on Elephant's Graveyard by George Brant. I paid the royalties during Wednesday night's show. I'm getting things checked off the to-do list. OH! That reminds me - I still need to apply for the rights for next year's musical. Maybe that is what I'll do tonight! Good things it's Show Time!! I get SO MUCH DONE! And it feels so good.


